What We Can Learn about Healthy Playing from Blind and Deaf Musicians

When we are missing a sense, as is the case with blind and deaf individuals, the brain compensates by refining other senses. The brain in these individuals also reorganizes itself so that a sensory area, such as the visual cortex, can process input from other senses, such as touch or hearing. This is called cross-modal neuroplasticity. We can learn about relying more on our senses in practice and performance by seeing how blind and deaf individuals learn and perform. A considerable amount of information will be found in chapter 7 in my new book, *The Musical Brain* (see below). The notes for that chapter will direct you to a number of sources.
